



As of c. 1930

- 1. Water cistern about 15' deep by 12' dia., of brick, buried below ground
- 2. Granite stone posts to provide barrier to brickyard
- 3. Six brick kilns
- 4. Area for clay working in preparation of brick
- 5. Hydraulic ram
- 6. Pipe leading in cistern to carry water uphill (assumed)

Above properties understood to have been subdivided from original Walker property.

- I Walker property - brick dwelling near P. River
- II Gordon property - brick dwelling, once a tavern, brick-yard located on property
- III Peterson property - brick dwelling located on some 4 Acres
